# ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

The Minutes of the TENTH Annual General Meeting held in Room 3, the ACC, Liverpool on 16<sup>th</sup> October 2017.

## 1. Welcome

The President, Dr Tajek Hassan, welcomed the 81 Fellows, 8 Members and 7 Associate Fellows and Associate Members to the meeting.

### 2. Apologies for absence

Apologies for absence were received from Fiona Lecky, Gautam Bodiwala, Claire Summers, Ian Anderson, Ed Glucksman, Chris Cutting, Anthony Priddis, Qazi Zia Ullah and Susan Wakeford

#### 3. Minutes

The Minutes of the meeting held in Bournemouth on 20<sup>th</sup> September 2016 were accepted as a correct record.

#### 4. Matters arising

There were none.

#### 5. President's report

Dr Hassan highlighted that his opening address earlier in the day contained much of his report during which he reported on the new workforce strategy agreed with NHSE and HEE amongst others. These are challenging times, as ever, as Emergency Departments continue to attract business. Dr Hassan confirmed that our first duty of care is to deliver a safe service and the strategy outlined to members is good news, He urged members to feedback to him with their thoughts and concerns.

#### 6. Ballot result

Dr Hassan confirmed the result of the ballot to elect a Dean, Dr Jason Long stood again and was elected unopposed. Dr Long's second term will therefore end at the AGM in 2020.

#### 7. Treasurer's report

Professor Mason reported on the year ending 31<sup>st</sup> December 2016. The Accounts have been audited and reviewed by the Corporate Governance Committee.

With the change of President in the autumn of 2016 a review of the College committee structure took place and we now have 51 committees (an increase of 10). There has been an increase in staffing numbers in the Examinations Team to cope with the increased demand for our suite of examinations. IT investment to replace the eportfolio and clinical audit systems is underway and we are providing an increased level of support for National Boards and for regions.

Professor Mason spoke of the proposal to increase subscriptions for 2018 and confirmed that the last increase took place in 2013. A paper is available on the website setting out the rationale for the proposed increase f£2.6% rounded up to the nearest £10. Life Members and Fellows are increased to create more of a differential with annual membership, Overseas Fellows fee would be rounded up to £400. Professor Mason reminded members that the subscription fees are subject to tax relieve at the highest marginal UK tax rate so for a 40% tax payer 40% of the fee can be claimed back.

Dr Hassan reiterated the need to make this slight increase, given that, as a young College we don't have the history of accumulating wealth over centuries (for example the Royal College of Physicians is 500 years old and the RCS Edinburgh even older).

Professor Tim Rainer asked about salary increases and Dr Hassan confirmed a cost of living rise to staff of 1% last April.

Professor Mason asked Fellow and Members to approve the subscriptions for 2018 and this was done. There were no votes against the increase.

Professor Mason also asked members to approve the re-appointment of the auditors, haysmacintyre and this was also done,

Professor Mason concluded by thanking Mr Gordon Miles for his invaluable support and to the College Finance team for all their hard work.

### 8. CEO's Report

Mr Miles took the opportunity to advise members that since he became CEO in 2010 membership numbers had increased significantly from around 3,000 to over 6,000 and still growing. He reminded members that he is employed to deliver what the College members want. He believes going forward that work needs to be developed on the new strategy, more IT development, work in order to be awarded the ISO 9001 standard and the RCEM Foundation. He also believes more could be done to develop a careers strategy. On the IT side, we have moved from paper applications for membership and examinations to online applications. We've moved our server to the cloud.

He urged members to get in touch with him should they need to highlight any concerns.
