

Case reports overview:

You are invited to send a submission for the 'Case reports' study day on 9 June 2022. The event will be held at the Royal College of Emergency Medicine, Octavia House, 54 Ayres Street, London, SE1 1EU.

Cases that will score highly are those **which have a clear and important clinical teaching point**. The highest-ranking submissions will be selected for an oral presentation whilst others will be invited to present a poster.

We would especially like to hear about:

- Cases with a clear clinical teaching point relevant to a broad range of clinicians
- Cases that have led to changes in local, national or international clinical practice
- Typical presentations of common conditions that have been managed very well and have a great teaching point
- Unusual presentations of common conditions with a great teaching point

Timeline

Submissions will close on 14 April 2022 at 23:59 BST. Case reports received after this time will not be accepted for judging. You can submit your abstract at this link.

All applicants, successful or not, will be notified via email from 28 April 2022.

Format

All oral presentations and posters will be presented at the event in Octavia House on 9 June 2022.

The RCEM Events team will be in touch with successful applicants with more information about the above in due course.

Submission content

The total words for each submission is 300. Submissions are split as shown below:

- Title (not included in the word count)
- Brief case summary: this is a summary highlighting the most important aspects of the case presentation and outcome.

- Teaching points: a key purpose of case reports is to provide case-based learning. Here applicants are asked to submit a very succinct summary of the main learning points.
- Additional information
- Reviewing: Judges will look at the following 3 areas:
 - Importance to EM
 - Quality of writing
 - Relevance
