ACP and Educational Supervisor Sign-off

2017 and 2022 ACP curriculum

The terminology and symbols for sign-off of the portfolio of evidence for credentialing by tACPs and Educational Supervisors has changed as we have migrated from the NHS Education for Scotland (NES) ePortfolio platform to risr/advance (formerly Kaizen) and transitioned from the 2017 to the 2022 ACP curriculum. The table below outlines the sign-off required for tACPs submitting for credential on both the 2017 and 2022 curriculum. Although the terminology used in NES for the 2017 curriculum is no longer in use, we have included it for comparison as many ACPs and supervisors are familiar with the previous terminology, and it may help to see what this has changed to in more recent submissions.
