IMPORTANT MEDICAL INFORMATION FOR HEALTHCARE STAFF
THIS PATIENT IS PHYSICALLY DEPENDENT ON DAILY STEROID THERAPY as a critical medicine. It must be given/taken as prescribed and never omitted or discontinued. Missed doses, illness or surgery can cause adrenal crisis requiring emergency treatment.
Patients not on daily steroid therapy or with a history of steroid usage may also require emergency treatment.

Steroid Emergency Card

It's not just patients with Addison's Disease who need steroid replacement

Patients on long term steroid therapy (by any route) are at risk of an adrenal crisis if they miss their medication *or* have intercurrent illness/injury.

- ⇒ Take/look at drug histories, particularly in patients who have nausea & vomiting, acute abdominal pain, acutely confused/decreased GCS, syncope, unexplained fever, or have been "long-lies".
- \Rightarrow Look for medic alert bracelets/necklaces and steroid cards.

Start steroids promptly in patients at risk of an adrenal crisis

Emergency Treatment of Adrenal Crisis

Hydrocortisone

- ♦ 100 mg IM or IV
- Followed by 200mg infusion over 24h in 5% dextrose
- ♦ Or 50mg every 6 hours IM or IV

Hydrocortisone IM or IV dosage:

- Infants up to 1 year 25mg
- ♦ Children 1 to 5 years 50mg
- ◊ Patients 6≥ years 100mg

Can be repeated 3-4 times in 24 hrs

Rehydrate

- ♦ IV Fluid bolus then Infusion
- Orrect electrolyte abnormalities

Moderate intercurrent illness

e.g. fever, infection requiring antibiotics, surgical procedure under local anaesthetic.

Double usual daily glucocorticoid use

Severe intercurrent illness

e.g. persistent vomiting, acute trauma, sepsis or surgery.

Hydrocortisone 100mg IM or IV

Refer to patient's sick day rules.
