Dear ACP

Combined Adult and Children Clinical Syllabus (ePortfolio) error

RCEM has become aware of an error within the 'blueprint' for the combined ACP Adult and Children Clinical Syllabus (2022 ACP curriculum) on the risr/advance ePortfolio platform. This only affects ACPs who have indicated that they intend to credential in both adults and children concurrently and have the 'ACP Adult & Children' role and programme visible on their dashboard profile and via the 'Goals' drop-down menu. ACPs with either an 'ACP Adult' or 'ACP Children' role and programme will be unaffected.

The impact of this error means that, when tagging to certain areas of the clinical syllabus from within a form, such as a WPBA, the completed event will not appear in the evidence section of the syllabus when viewed from the dashboard or 'Goals' drop-down menu. The conditions and presentations affected are listed below:

• Oncological Emergencies

- OncP1. Acute presentations of undiagnosed cancer that may present to the ED
- OncC1. Complications related to local tumour progression
- OncC2. Complications relating to cancer treatment
- OncC3. Biochemical complications of malignancy

Pain & sedation

- PC1. Analgesics
- PC2. Non-pharmacological methods of pain management
- PC3. Pain assessment
- PC4. Sedation

Sexual health

- SeP1. Genital discharge
- SeP2. Genital lesions
- SeP3. Emergency contraception
- SeP4. Post-exposure prophylaxis
- SeC2. Sexual assault
- SeC3. Sexually transmitted infections

Vascular

- VC1. Acute limb ischaemia0
- VC2. Aortic aneurysmal disease0
- VC3. DVT

ACPs who commence the credentialing pathway from 22 March 2024 will have an amended version of the combined adult and children clinical syllabus uploaded to their ePortfolio account. Unfortunately, it has not been possible to overwrite the old version of the syllabus with the amended version for ACPs who commenced the credentialing pathway prior to this date. Therefore, to ensure that evidence appears against these presentations and conditions (event targets), and the ACP Credentialing Panel are able to view the evidence upon submission, we are asking ACPs to manually link their evidence to these specific areas from the syllabus itself. This will apply to evidence already tagged to these conditions and presentations within assessments, as well as to future evidence that will also need to be linked to these areas of the syllabus.



Instructions

1. Select ACP Syllabus (2022) from the Goals drop-down menu.



2. Click on the relevant area of the syllabus. For this example, we are using Pain & Sedation, PC1. Analgesics.




3. For the event target **PC1. Analgesics**, click on **Link event to this target** and choose **Select existing event** from the drop-down options.



4. The default position means that you will only see events that match this goal's targets. Click on **Show all events**.



5. Type **PC1** into the search field to filter the results to only show events that you have tagged to PC1 within forms/assessments. Then click on **Link this event** for all items of evidence you wish to link to **PC1**. **Analgesics**.



6. When you have selected all of the evidence you wish to link, click on
