


While less susceptible to changes to crime recording practices than some crime types (eg stalking and harassment or domestic abuse), violence with injury crime data paints a different picture to health data.

In the latest 12 months of GMP data, levels of serious violence are 16% higher than pre-COVID


In the latest 12 months of Emergency Department data, levels of interpersonal violence are 30% lower than pre-COVID

In the latest 12 months of hospital admissions data, levels of serious violence are 38% lower than pre-COVID


### Police Recorded Violent Crime




### Ambulance Call Outs due to Assault




### A&E Attendances due to Assault

### Home Address of People Attending A&E



# GM NAVIGATORS

Youth workers

Initially hospital based in Major Trauma Centres and Trauma Unit

Now accepting community referrals

>800 referrals for vulnerable young people

Bespoke support programme for CYP 10-25 affected by violence



# STOP THE BLEED DAY 2023

Pilot in 11 schools

Taught 1687 children bleed control skills in a single day

No specialised equipment

Self-reported confidence in managing bleeding rose from 22% to 80%

Rolling out further in 2024

In conjunction with Citizen Aid




# UniteHER Aims

Pre - birth : substance misuse, DV

0-2 : substance misuse, maternal mental health

2: parental relationship breakdown

5 : father imprisoned

11: difficult transition to secondary school - bullying

14: befriended by older 'gang' members - criminal exploitation

# A PERSON WITH 4 OR MORE ACES IS

14 x more likely to have been a victim of violence in the last 12 months

- 15x more likely to have been the perpetrator of violence in the last 12 months.

20 x more likely to have been incarcerated at any point in their lives

- Those with 4 or more ACEs are more likely to live in deprived areas, be unemployed or on long term sickness and have no qualifications
